The Wellington Arts Association

Formed in the 1960s, the Wellington (Somerset) & District Arts Association (WAA) brings together a number of groups interested in the Arts in the Wellington area under one roof and promotes their activities.

At the Arts Centre we provide facilities for rehearsals, meetings, exhibitions, workshops, amateur and professional performances.

We also own the Wellesley Theatre, which we lease to a separate company to run as a cinema. We have use of the building to run 2 shows a year. The Wellington Pantomime Group stages an annual pantomime in January and The Wellington Operatic Society stages a musical in May.

By becoming a member of the association, you automatically become a member of all of our constituent groups, allowing you to attend any of our groups and join in with their activities. Membership also allows you to advance book WAA productions.



As a member, you will be able to enjoy membership of The Critics Club, the WAA's members' bar - a friendly meeting place where members can enjoy a drink and a chat.

On top of the productions and events organised by the constituent groups, the Arts Association Management Committee also organises, hosts or supports a variety of events as part of its year round arts programme.

Genesis Youth Theatre



Our award winning Youth Theatre Group was founded in 1996 with the purpose of introducing young people to all aspects of the performing arts.

In the past they have performed hit plays, musicals and cabarets including Kes, Sparkleshark and Bugsy Malone.

Wellington Pantomime Group



Our multi-award winning pantomime group produces a week long annual show which is staged at our 400 seat Wellesley Theatre in Wellington.

The group has won many awards since it was founded back in 1975, including the prestigious Cinderella Trophy many times.

Wellington Operatic Society



The Operatic Society stages an annual musical at the Wellesley Theatre, as well as a cabaret show of its own devising each autumn at the Arts Centre.

It also provides entertainment to other organisations and at other local events through its Touring Group.

Wellington Theatre Company



Wellington Theatre Company forms the dramatic side of the association.

It stages dramas, comedies, plays and farces at the Arts Centre, often choosing to tackle complex and interesting shows, such as the award-winning Blue Remembered Hills and Calendar Girls.

Spectrum Arts & Crafts



Spectrum Arts & Crafts is the art & craft section of the WAA.

The group meets weekly at the Arts Centre every Monday.

Talks, demonstrations and workshops are arranged occasionally with an annual exhibition at the Arts Centre.

Visitors are always welcome.
